During her time at the free clinics, Soltani developed and implemented a universal depression screening tool to help practitioners diagnose depression in their patients. The screening tool proved to be very successful in helping providers identify depression in low-income and underserved patients.

Each year, SDCMS Foundation scholarships are awarded to University of California San Diego Medical School students whose personal beliefs, actions and community service align with their mission. Scholarships are also awarded to first-year residents hoping to serve the medically underserved in our community. Soltani was one of four finalists and will receive \$1,000 per year for each year of her residency. Soltani will also have her expense paid for the San Diego County Medical Society's annual trip to Sacramento where medical students and residents participate in legislative meetings and events.
